

Abdulwahid Qalinle

Abdulwahid Qalinle has served as an Adjunct Professor at the University of Minnesota Law School since 2004. He is an expert in the areas of Comparative Constitutional Law, Islamic law, International Law, and the Rule of Law. Qalinle received advanced degrees in law from the International Islamic University in Islamabad, Pakistan and from the University of Minnesota Law School. Prior to his studies in law, he was a researcher at the Islamic Research Institute, a leading Islamabad-based think-tank. Qalinle currently teaches Islamic Law at the University of Minnesota Law School. He also works at Metro Law Group, P.A., a Minneapolis-based law firm.

Most recently, Qalinle was the founding Chair of the Somaliland Law Reform Commission, focusing on rebuilding the Rule of Law and Transitional Justice in post-conflict environments. He also served as Quest Professor, working under the auspices of the United Nations Development Program in Hargeisa, Somalia where he gave in-class lectures in law courses as well as undertaking curriculum and staff development training with the Faculty of Law & Legal Clinic at Hargeisa University and Amoud University in Somalia.

Qalinle is a leading authority on the merger of Islamic law and the Anglo-Saxon Legal System, a frequent guest speaker at universities and colleges and a commentator with local and international media outlets such as BBC, VOA, Minnesota Public Radio, the Minneapolis-based Star Tribune, and the Associated Press, among others. Qalinle sits on the Boards of several organizations in Minnesota. He lives in Minneapolis with his family.
